PRESIDENTS REPORT

Over the past 12 months the club has been in a fairly steady state, we have not had any huge achievements outside of the pool however I believe the club is in a good position and running at a sustainable level.

We ran two barbecues one at Bunnings and one at the Wallan Market which were very well run thanks to our fundraising coordinators Steve and Tim who have done a fantastic job over the past 12 month. The barbecues are a great fundraiser for the club and besides the work put in by Steve and Tim very easy on our volunteers. The number of entries at our annual swim meet was steady at 662 which is a good manageable size. The meet again ran very smoothly this year thanks to our team of volunteers and was well received by visiting clubs. Following on from the officials training held prior to the Kilmore Pennant, Sam Ireland successfully passed his practical assessment at our annual meet and is now a qualified Judge of Stroke. This is great for the club and great for the swimming community, hopefully we see some more parents following in Sam's footsteps in this coming season.

We received a grant for \$750 from Sport and Recreation Victoria to assist Ethan Daws with his travel expenses to Australian Swimming Championships in Brisbane in preparation for the World Transplant Games.

Attendance at championship meets has increased over the past season with good sized teams attending, Country SC Championships, Country Championships, Victorian Age Championships, Victorian Open Championships, Victorian Sprint Championships and Country All Junior Championships. This is great for the individual swimmers and great for the club to be represented by so many swimmers at these high profile meets.

We have had numerous championship medallists over the past 12 months, with Ethan Daws medalling at Country SC Championships, Victorian SC Championships, Australian SC Championships and the World Transplant Games, Bailey Harriden medalling at Country Championships and Somaiya Harriden, Alesha McIntosh and Alexander Killender all medalling at Country All Juniors finals. This is great for the individual swimmers and lifts the profile of the club in the swimming community. Hopefully their efforts will inspire our younger swimmers to aim high and reach their goals. The committee has been in the process of updating the club handbook and by-laws to bring them into line with current practices and the new Swimming Australia Safe Sports Framework. The incoming committee will need to continue on this path to ratify the documents and release them to the members.

I would like to acknowledge my fellow committee members; Lisa Bess, Jennifer Lonie, Andrea Boland, Marissa Cardamone, Noleen Cornish, Steve Daws, and Tim Finn for their valued service and commitment to the Kilmore Swimming Club. This small group of volunteers do an enormous amount of work behind the scene to keep the club running and on track. Sadly we will be losing three of our committee members this year, Andrea, Noleen and Tim will not be renominating for positions on the committee. I would like to wish them well on their future endeavours and hope they enjoyed their time at the club and on the committee.

This season also saw club life member Noelene Pyle step down from her role as coach a leave the club for retirement. Noelene has been a member of the club for over 20 years and on the committee for most of them. We all know her from her coaching role, but you may not know that Noelene has also served as club president, recorder, property officer, district secretay and many more. Noelene has been a cornerstone in the club on a number of occations, we have shared some great times and some not so great time. Noelen will be missed on pool deck and at meets, we wish you all the best in your retirement and travels. Thank you for your service.

I would like to say a special thank you to Lisa who despite being the 'Acting Secretary' this season, has undertaken the job with her usual professionalism and unwavering commitment. Lisa's assistance over the last 12 months has been invaluable and very much appreciated by myself and the committee.

TREASURERS REPORT

Starting the 2016/2017 season our financial position was looking very strong, we had a balance of \$18,588.05 in the bank with no outstanding commitments. There was no general income this season with the only grant received being specifically to assist Ethan Daws to attend the Australian Swimming Championships in Brisbane on his preparations for the World Transplant Games.


Income from lane fees was \$25,943.34 this season with \$19,650.99 of this paid back to the Mitchell Shire in pool hire for training. The increase in income is due to the restructuring of the fees to provide the club a sustainable future. The increase in lane fees to the Mitchell shire is a direct reflection of the clubs growth, even though overall numbers have increased, swimmer have consistently been attending more sessions.

We have run a Bunnings barbecues, the Wallan Market barbecue our Annual Swim Meet, the Kilmore Pennant and the Spring Fling over the past season. The Bunnings and Wallan Market barbecues brought in a combined profit of \$2,673.40 and the Annual Swim Meet brought in around \$3,632.00 in profit, a great result for a couple of days work.

Overall the clubs finances are in a good position. The profit from the past season was \$2,232.58 which show that our income is going back into the club to improve equipment, uniform, facilities and activities for the members.

In conclusion I believe the Kilmore Swimming Clubs finances are in a positive position. We have enough money in the bank to run our current programs and should look at the possibility of expanding them over the next few seasons.

COACHES REPORT

This season we have seen a great group of swimmers come together as a team and produce some really great results. Our participation at championship meets has increased, not only in swimmer but also in the number of swims each swimmer has qualified for. With medallist at Country SC, Victorian SC, Countries and All Juniors, the quality of swimming that is coming out of the program has also increased. At the top end the swimmers are gaining a better understanding of the program and are working together as a team to motivate each other through tough sets. At the bottom the swimmers skills have increased along with their love for the sport, adapting to the program as we progressed through the summer season, we could not be prouder of our juniors and what they have achieved.

Throughout the season we welcomed nine new members whom all have been very valuable additions to our team. Retention within the club has been very good with the club only losing five swimmers over the season.

Championship meets have been very well attended with 18 separate swimmers attending championship meets over the season, almost 50% of our swimmers at the time! Country championships meets being the most attended with 15 at short course, 11 at long course and nine at All Juniors. We must thank all of the swimmers (and their parents) who made the trek to Sale for Country Championships in January, we were pleasantly surprised with the large team!

Over the season we had five swimmer compete in championship finals and picked up 17 medals at championship meets. This is not only great for the individual swimmer but also reflects well on the club and the rest of the team.

The pennant season saw us finish in second position, moving us closer to the ilusive Pennant Shield. Once again our girls have represented the club well taking the female pennant flag. We brought home the district championship shield again along with 19 out of 28 individual trophies on offer. The club provided 18 out of 39 swimmers for the Country Interdistrict meet which shows we are growing stronger as a club.
